

Stradbroke

Monday - Friday 8:30 - 12:30, Mondays and Fridays only 3:45 - 6:15

We are following social distancing rules with 2 metres between patients collecting prescriptions or attending the surgery, and a 1 at a time rule. Please stand behind the chairs when you come in to keep everyone safe.

Our current timescales for processing medications is 4 days, so if you put in a request at the weekend it will be ready the following Friday. On weekdays, if you put in a request on a Monday it will be ready the following Monday. Unfortunately we cannot provide double issues or medications that are not yet due.

The cost of a prescription is £9.15 and we encourage payment by contactless card, if you have regular medication it is cheaper to buy a pre-payment certificate.

If you are vulnerable and unable to collect medications yourself someone else can do so with your consent. If you do not have anyone who can help call us and we can give details of volunteers in your area. Please ensure the person collect for you knows your name, address and date of birth and they will need to know whether or not you pay for your prescriptions. If the collection includes a controlled drug they will require ID too.

Ways to help us

- Where possible please put your repeat requests into the dispensary you will collect from
- Only phone if you really need to, and after 11:00. We are very busy at the moment
- Please fill in the prescription carefully!
- If you order online please specify your preferred pickup, if you do not they will be completed at Fressingfield

Finally..!

We are a small team who want to support you as much as we can. Thank you so much for your patience and understanding at this time. We are working very hard to meet current demand and are grateful for your kind comments and good humour!

If you are self shielding at the moment please take very good care and stay safe. We look forward to seeing you when it is safe to do so.

From our Cookery Correspondent...

Gin & Tonic Cake

Back in the good old days when we were allowed to travel and take holidays, we came across this recipe and thought it perfect for you lovely residents of Brundish and Wilby who enjoy a good tipple or two! If you are lucky enough to have flour, roll up your selves and give it a go, it is delicious and so good for you too!!

Ingredients:

- 200g butter, softened
- 200g sugar
- 4 eggs beaten
- 200g self-raising flour
- ½ tsp baking powder
- · 1 lime, finely grated zest only
- 85ml gin

Drizzle and icing

- 100g sugar
- 120ml tonic water
- 3½ tbsp gin
- 1 lime cut in half lengthways and very finely sliced into half moons
- 50g icing sugar
- Heat oven to 180C/350F/gas mark 4. Grease a 900g/2lb loaf tin and line the base and sides.
- 2. Cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Gradually add the eggs, beating well after each addition.
- 3. Fold in the flour, baking powder and lime zest, then gradually add the gin. Place the mix into the prepared tin, smooth the top to level and bake for 55-60 mins. Test that the cake is cooked by inserting a skewer into the cake and it comes out clean.
- 4. Place the 100g sugar and tonic water in a small pan and gently warm stirring all the time until the sugar melts. Turn up the heat and boil for 1 minute. Spoon 2 tbsp of syrup into asmall bowl and mix in 2½ tbsp of the gin. Set aside.
- 5. Add the sliced lime to the remaining tonic syrup in the saucepan, bring to the boil and simmer for 5-7 minutes until the lime slices are soft and the syrup thickened. Leave to cool.
- 6. As soon as the cake comes out of the oven, poke holes into the top with a skewer and drizzle over the reserved gin syrup. Leave to cool on a wire rack.
- 7. Make the icing by mixing the icing sugar with the remaining gin until smooth. Remove the cake from the tin and paper. Put the icing into a piping bag and drizzle over the cake. Decorate with the lime slices and leave to set.



And for our junior chefs....

Veg & Nut Noodle Stir Fry

This is a very quick and tasty dish which will serve 2 people but is easily amended to feed more if required. Make sure you have all your ingredients ready prepared before you start to cook.

Ingredients:

- 85g dried noodles
- 2 tsp clear honey
- 2 tbsp dark soy sauce
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 4 cm piece of fresh root ginger, grated
- 1 clove of garlic, crushed
- 2 carrots, cut into batons (sticks)
- ½ each of red and yellow peppers, deseeded and sliced
- 175g broccoli, slice into bite-size florets
- · 100g mushrooms, thinly sliced
- 6 spring onions, cut into thin strips
- · 60g cashew nuts or peanuts
- 1. Cook the noodles according to the packet instructions, then drain.
- Put the honey, soy sauce and 2 table spoons (tbsps.) water in a small bowl and stir to mix. Set aside
- 3. Heat the oil in a large frying pan or wok. Add the ginger, garlic, carrots, peppers, broccoli and mushrooms and stir fry over a high heat for 3-4 minutes until crisp but tender. If they stick before being cooked, carefully add a splash of water to the pan.
- 4. Add the spring onions and stir fry for 1 minute more. Add the noodles and sauce then toss to combine. Warm through then soon onto plates and sprinkle over the nuts.

You can experiment with alternative vegetables, baby corn, courgette, runner beans or leeks would all work well.

Wilby Parish Council

The Parish Council has not met since its last meeting on 4 March 2020 because of the current coronavirus restrictions. It has not yet proved necessary to convene a formal meeting of the council. If it does become necessary for the council to meet collectively to consider matters requiring a formal council decision then the intention is to set up a virtual meeting to which the public would have access. Details would be made known on the Parish Council noticeboard and through the council's email register. Meantime the Annual Parish Meeting has been postponed to May 2021.

The Wilby Neighbourhood Plan is going through the final stages of preparation before its formal submission to the District Council. The Parish Council will need to meet (virtually) to sign off the Plan for submission, this meeting hopefully taking place in June/July 2020. The public will have access to this meeting as observers but will not be able to comment upon or challenge the content of the Plan. There will be a further opportunity for public comment before a referendum is held on the Plan.

Brundish and Wilby Defibrillators

4 steps to take if someone is having a cardiac arrest

Cardiac arrests can happen to anyone, at any time. The following steps give someone the best chance of survival. If you come across someone in cardiac arrest:

- Call 999. If calling from Brundish also request the Defibrillator access code
- Start CPR
- Ask someone to fetch a defibrillator (see below)
- Turn on the defibrillator and follow its instructions.

Brundish Defibrillator

- Located in the old telephone box on Crown Corner
- Access code available via 999 (Ambulance Service)
- If you need help to fetch the defibrillator call 01728 628696.
 This service is voluntary, availability is not guaranteed

Wilby Defibrillator

- Located in the old telephone box near the village hall
- The access code to open the defibrillator cabinet is C159X.
- If you need help to fetch the defibrillator in an emergency call 01379 844704. This service is voluntary, availability is not guaranteed

Who can use a defibrillator?

Anyone can use it, you don't need to be trained. There are clear instructions on how to attach the defibrillator pads. The unit will then assess the heart rhythm and will only instruct you to deliver a shock if it's needed. You cannot deliver a shock accidentally; the defibrillator will only allow you to shock if it is needed. Source: British Heart Foundation


